Elwood (Woody)B. Hausler, 86, of Hattiesburg, passed away Saturday, July 9, 2022 at Asbury Hospice House. A gathering of family and friends will be held on Saturday July 30, 2022, 3:00 p.m. at Parkway Heights United Methodist Church.

He was preceded in death by his parents Chester and Margaret Hausler. He is survived by his wife of 61 years, Nancy C. Hausler, his daughter, Lorraine M. Chotin, and his cousin, Rodney Haas.

Woody graduated from Alfred University in 1959 and pursued a career in Ceramic Engineering, Quality Control and was a certified as a Master Black Belt in Six Sigma, a quality control program launched by General Electric.

Woody served as a Planning and Zoning Board member for Grand Island, NY for twenty years, he was a 35 year member of Trinity United Methodist Church on Grand Island and an active

member of Parkway Heights United Methodist Church in Hattiesburg since 2008. He enjoyed volunteer work with Edwards Street Food Pantry and tutoring early readers. Most of all he enjoyed math tutoring and providing youth with problem-solving experiences to build their understanding of math facts and skills.
